Music Sunday November 22nd: A Protestant Mass Kyrie eleison: Lord have mercy

The first part of the Mass Ordinary (the unchanging elements sung in every service) is Kyrie eleison, simply called Kyrie. It serves a similar purpose as our prayer of confession. The Kyrie first existed in pagan traditions and 4th century Jerusalem before being adopted and molded

into the form it holds today. Each line of the original Greek text is repeated three times in a prayer. In her A Protestant Mass written for Music Sunday Christianne Bessières Lane chose to set each line of the Greek text first for a soloist. Then the choir followed by the choir and congregation respond to each line in English: Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord have mercy.
